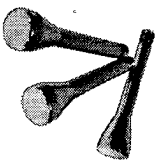

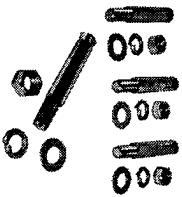

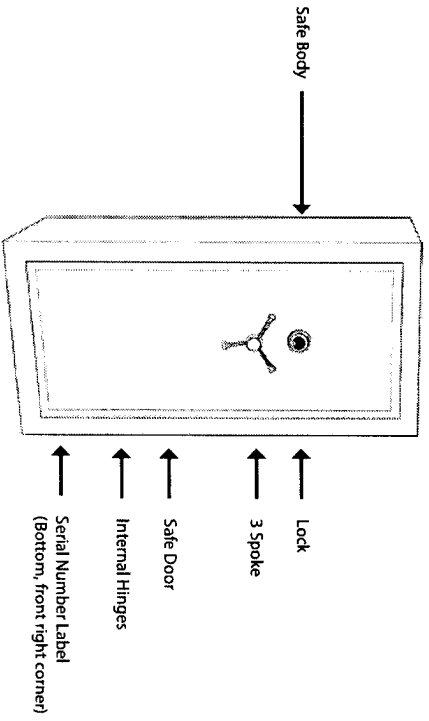

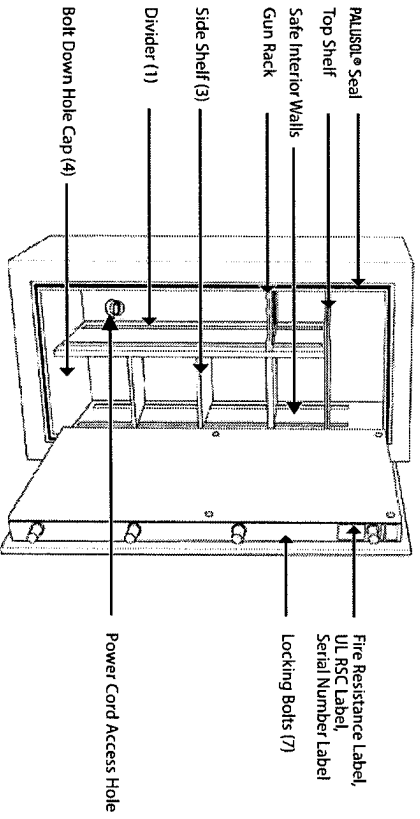

OPENING SAFE FOR THE FIRST TIME

⚠ IMPORTANT

EXTENDING BOLTS BEFORE VERIFYING COMBINATION

It is preferred to verify your safe combination with the door open. If there are problems, it is easier to service the lock or mechanism with the door open. Before verifying your combination, you will need to extend the door bolts while the door is open. Keep the door open. You can now verify your combination.

VERIFYING THE COMBINATION

The combination lock on your safe has been set randomly at the factory. After completely dialing the combination provided with your safe, turn the safe handle clockwise and open the door. With the door open it is recommended that you verify the combination opens a few times before using the safe. It is also strongly recommended to do this after moving the safe.

LOCK-OPENING INSTRUCTIONS

The lock requires accurate alignment with the index mark (located at twelve o'clock on the dial ring). Always turn the dial slowly and steadily when entering your combination to avoid dialing past your numbers. **Never spin the dial rapidly back and forth as this may cause damage to the lock.** If you go past any number - even if by only a half a number - the entire combination must be re-dialed. To verify your combination, follow the eight steps below.

Step 1 - Locate the handle spoke in the plastic bag and remove the protective cover.

Step 2 - Screw in the handle spoke at the bottom of the handle hub.

Step 3 - Locate the combination printed on page 13 of Safes Identification Record.



Step 4
Turn the dial counter-clockwise (LEFT) at least 4 times, stopping on the 1st number at the index mark.

1st # _____



Step 5
Turn the dial clockwise (RIGHT), passing the 2nd number twice. Stop on it the 3rd time.

2nd # _____



Step 6
Turn the dial counter-clockwise (LEFT) passing the 3rd number once. Stop on it the 2nd time.

3rd # _____



Step 7
Turn the dial clockwise (RIGHT) until the dial stops (about 87). You will feel some resistance at about 95. Keep turning until the dial completely stops at about 87.

Step 8 - If combination is entered correctly, you will be able to easily turn the handle clockwise and pull the door open.

A. IF THE COMBINATION DOES NOT WORK, DO NOT CLOSE THE DOOR! Try Again. Refer to the TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE on page 9, for more help.

CHANGING COMBINATIONS ON MANUAL LOCKS

It is inadvisable for anyone other than a CERTIFIED LOCKSMITH to change the combination on a manual lock. Changing the combination by anyone other than a certified technician will void the lock portion of your warranty.

LOCKING THE COMBINATION DIAL

If the combination dial is in unlocked status:

1. Turn the dial to "0" position.
2. Insert the key and turn the key counter-clockwise to lock the dial.

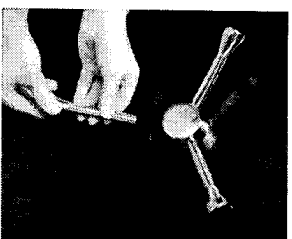
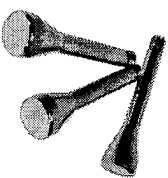
If the combination dial is in locked status:

1. Insert the key and turn the key clockwise to unlock the dial.
2. Now the dial can be turned to input the combination.

INSTALLING THE HANDLE SPOKES

Follow OPENING SAFE FOR THE FIRST TIME on page 4 before proceeding.

1. Locate two (2) additional spokes inside the safe and remove protective covers.
2. Screw spokes into the handle hub.



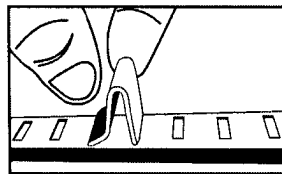
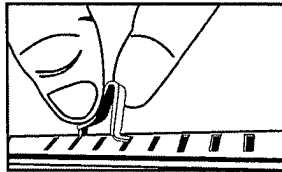
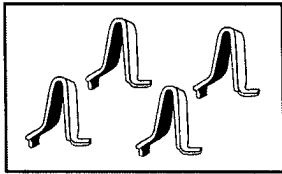
OPTIONAL

To prevent loosening, apply one drop of Thread Lock on the threads of each spoke.
NOTE: Thread Lock is not included. Purchase from your local hardware store.

SHELF INSTALLATION

NOTE: Determine desired height and layout of shelves before you begin installation.

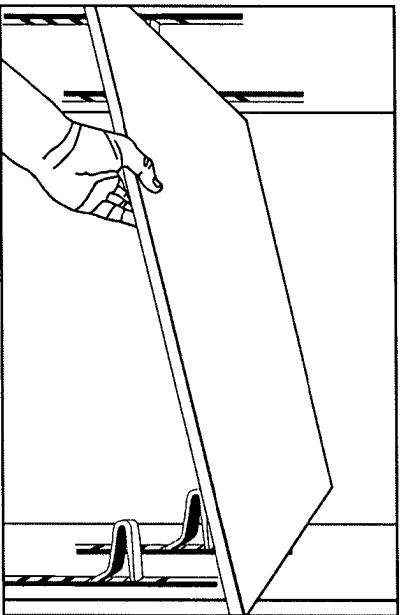
1. Locate Metal Shelf Clips inside the safe.
2. Insert the top of the clip into the notch.
3. Push the bottom of the clip into the lower notch.



IMPORTANT

Four (4) clips are required for each shelf. Make sure all four (4) clips are in alignment before moving on to step 4.

4. Carefully place shelf on top of the clips.



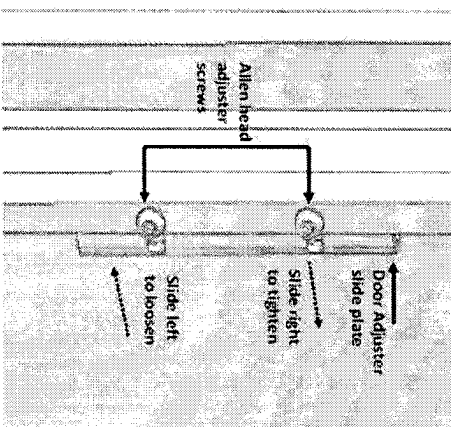
5. To remove clips, squeeze the clip with your hand or pliers and lift up.

BOLTING YOUR SAFE TO THE FLOOR

- Locate the four (4) Concrete Bolts inside the safe.
 - Remove interior shelving and the four (4) Bolt Down Hole Caps.
 - Position the safe before marking the floor through the holes in the bottom of the safe.
 - Move the safe and drill holes in the floor where marked in step 3 with a 5/8 inch masonry bit.
 - Reposition the safe over the holes and install the four (4) Concrete Bolts.
 - To prevent heat from entering the safe during a fire, fill the holes with a high temperature silicone caulk.
- NOTE:** Caulk is not included. Purchase from your local hardware store.
- Replace the four (4) Bolt Down Hole Caps and interior shelving.

DOOR ADJUSTERS

Most safe models have one or two adjusters for tightening or loosening the door. These adjusters are located just inside the left side of the safes doorjamb. After removing all packaging materials, close the door and extend the bolts. Pull out on the door handle to check the tightness. If there is play in the door, you will need to adjust the slide. Using the supplied door adjustment wrench, loosen the two (2) adjuster screws. Slide the adjuster left to loosen the door, right to tighten the door. Re-tighten screws and check door again for fit. When properly adjusted, you should feel slight resistance when turning the handle to extend the door bolts. Only slight movement should be felt with the door shut.



Caution: Do not adjust door too tight. This may cause wear on both the door pins and locking mechanism. If your door has a tendency to self-open (the bolts retract by themselves) or the handle is hard to turn when extending the bolts, the door adjusters may be too tight.

TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE

PROBLEM	SOLUTION

Door Rattles When Shut	Verify that the handle is rotating completely and that the locking bolts are fully extending. Refer to the DOOR ADJUSTERS section on Page 8.

USE, CARE AND MAINTENANCE

When properly maintained, your safe will continue to operate and accurately read the authorized combination for many years. In order to ensure optimal performance of your safe, please follow these simple precautions:

Clean Hand – Never attempt to operate the mechanical dial if your hands have excess dirt, debris or liquids on them.

Clean Safe – To clean the surface of your safe, it is recommended that you use a mild cleaner (e.g., window cleaner) to avoid scratching or discoloring the surface. Always wipe dry and NEVER use abrasive cleansers on the safe.

Moisture – We recommend that you place delicate items such as pictures or intricate jewelry into an air-tight container before storing them in your safe. Avoid placing your safe in areas of high humidity. For optimum performance, the safe should be opened and aired out for at least 20 minutes every two weeks.

For future reference, store this Operation and Installation Guide in a secure area away from the safe. DO NOT DISCARD!

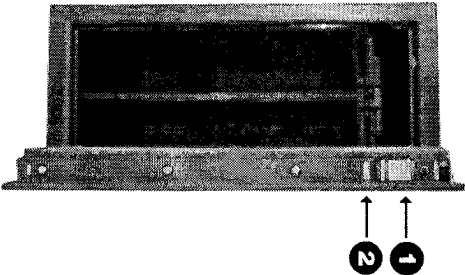

⚠ IMPORTANT DO NOT REMOVE TAGS

In case your safe becomes inoperable these identification numbers will be needed to correct the problem. It is recommended that the number tags remain in place on the safe. If removal is necessary, then they should be attached to the inside back cover of this manual. Store in a safe and secure place for future reference.

BRK, at its sole option, will repair or replace this product or any component of the product found to be defective during the warranty period. Replacement or repair will be made with a new or refurbished product or component. If the product is no longer available, replacement may be made with a similar product of equal or greater value. This is your exclusive warranty.

This warranty is only valid for the original retail purchaser from the date of initial retail purchase and is not transferable. You must keep the original sales receipt. Proof of purchase is required to obtain warranty performance. BRK dealers, service centers, or retail stores selling this product do not have the right to alter, modify or in any way change the terms and conditions of this warranty.
